Last week, we received new instructions and guidelines from the diocese concerning our COVID protocol. Counties that have a moderate transmission rate or below may now begin distributing wine in communion, via intinction. We were able to have communion in both kinds for the first time in over a year! It was certainly a cause for celebration and thanksgiving to God for a step forward. We are not yet where we would like to be but we aren't where we were, that's for sure.

I came across a quote the other day from Eugene Peterson that connects with this idea. Peterson, the pastor and translator of *The Message*, was famous for his reflections on ministry and everyday life. One such reflection was the statement, "Every step an arrival." Now there is quite a bit of wisdom packed into that



phrase. When human beings are enduring a tough and painful spot, a temptation arises to look beyond the present moment and towards a potential utopia that is just out of reach. Until the fullness of that dream is captured, we cannot rest. But the problem with utopias is in the name; the word "u-topos" literally means "no-place." No place on earth, anyway.

Instead, Peterson urges us to see every moment as the place of God's leading. We are exactly where we need to be; we are experiencing God's Fatherly care in every step up faith. We won't capture utopia on earth, but if we will place our longings in God and His kingdom, the shadows and half-reflections of that reality will become earth's finest joys. The fullness of blessedness is only in Zion. So enjoy every step on earth in the light of God's grace!



## YOUTH

Trinity youth have been very involved with helping the homeless population this past year. They have worked in Martha's Kitchen and participated in activities to help better understand what life is like trying to survive daily. Over the Christmas holidays, we packed and delivered 23 care packages to the homeless. These packages included much-needed items, but the most important item was a Bible and flashlight. As Proverbs 19:17 reminds us, "Whoever is generous to the poor lends to the Lord." It is the understanding of the youth that this work is to bring honor and glory to God, and it is our mission to help the recipients of these gifts know this as well, always willing to share our faith.

One of our success stories is my friend Phyllis. When I first met her, she had been on the streets for several months. An illness had caused her to lose her job and eventually everything. She was diagnosed with breast cancer in December and is undergoing treatment. The youth have raised awareness and reached out to organizations and individuals to help raise funds to put her up in a hotel to rest after chemo treatments. Even through all her trials, I have witnessed her taking care of the needs of her homeless friends, providing them with food, and sharing what she could. When one of their most beloved friends passed away, she asked me to conduct a memorial service. I was incredibly excited to have the opportunity to share the hope and love that I have in Jesus, inviting them to share in that comfort as well. Phyllis has been a conduit for me to reach out to a community of untouchables and bring in the love of God. The expressions on their faces when they realize that you care is priceless.

Over the past year I have seen her struggle to get back on her feet with several setbacks. Just this month she has secured a job working over 40 hours a week and has moved into an apartment. She has a roof over her head at long last but is in need of everything that belongs in a home. If you are putting any household items out, even the smallest of things, please consider Phyllis. Furniture, clothing, or anything would be appreciated. Her shoe size is 6-61/2. She wears medium tops and size 6 pants. If you like to know more about Phyllis, please contact me.

## SENIOR WARDEN'S ADDRESS

Dear Trinity Family,

Greetings to you! I am so grateful for spring that I don't even mind the pollen this year. It is wonderful to see all the baby calves and leaves on the trees again. Easter Sunday is very near and it will be wonderful to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord together. In many ways to me, this feels like an invigorating fresh start.

The vestry set forth a lean and balanced budget for the year, and we have agreed with Rev. Sean that for additional funding and projects, we will conduct fundraising outside the fall stewardship campaign. I also have heard from many of you regarding specific needs that should be addressed, as well as those that would like to financially support identified needs of our parish in designated funds. As a result, I would like to offer three designated accounts to receive your contributions.



The vestry set forth a lean and balanced budget for the year, and we have agreed with Rev. Sean that for additional funding and projects, we will conduct fundraising outside the fall stewardship campaign. I also have heard from many of you regarding specific needs that should be addressed, as well as those that would like to financially support identified needs of our parish in designated funds. As a result, I would like to offer three designated accounts to receive your contributions.

1) Refurbishment of roof and flooring for All Saint's Hall—2021 to 2023. The vestry is still working to gather quotes and a construction plan, but at this time, I would like to set a goal of raising \$75,000 to repair the roof structure, replace the shingles, pressure wash, complete the painting and new flooring throughout the building, and stripe the parking lot and driveway. The roof of this building has some leaks that over time will cause deterioration of the structure. We would like to perform a substantial repair that will carry us into the future. We would also like to install a low-cost and attractive floor that will reduce maintenance costs over the existing tile. "Sweat equity" is always welcome from anyone that wishes to volunteer or offer the services of their business towards this effort.

2) Annual scholarship to help with expenses for tuition at University of Edinburgh for Rev. Sean. Scholarship is a wonderful way for our church to directly support Rev. Sean in his ministry and growth and to absorb some of the high cost of living for this young family. We are also looking for matching funds and scholarship funds and will continue to do so. If you have questions, please feel free to contact me.

3) Trinity School is our largest outreach as a church. Rae Dickson, our youth minister, is a part of the faculty of the school and both Rae and Rev. Sean teach at the school. We have set an annual budget of \$6,000 annually for additional financial support of the school that comes from our operating budget. Earmarked contributions for an annual bonus for teachers at the school from Trinity Church would be a tremendous blessing. The Board and administrative staff at the school are looking to raise about \$20,000 to give each teacher a \$1,000 bonus at the end of the year. Normally, teacher bonuses are raised through Friends of Trinity, but COVID did not allow the normal fundraising to occur this year. Keep in mind, the school has operated throughout this time, established protocols, and was far enough ahead of their curriculum that the week off due to the blizzard, will not be required to be made up by the students.

4) Annual Thanksgiving Outreach and Martha's Kitchen. This Thanksgiving Outreach ministry currently has funding for the fall 2021 year. Continued funding along with our volunteers will ensure the tradition continues. Martha's Kitchen is currently well funded, blessed with a fund balance of \$37,416! Lacking sufficient volunteers, we are challenged to be good stewards of this ministry. As a result, we are seeking to hire a Martha's Kitchen Assistant Director that can facilitate volunteer teams from the community on behalf of the parish when a volunteer is not available, etc. I am happy to report that the community is beginning to respond to our request for volunteers.



## DEVOTIONAL PRACTICES AT HOME

### TENEBRAE

Due to logistical complications, we had to cancel this year's Tenebrae service. We will miss hearing our talented choir, but we can still pray the service without music. It is an ancient form of worship and the psalms, lessons, and responses are especially edifying and set the tone for Holy Week. The liturgy can be found online by downloading the file for The Book of Occasional Services [https://www.episcopalchurch.org/wp-content/uploads/sites/2/2021/01/lm\\_book\\_of\\_occasional\\_services\\_2018.pdf](https://www.episcopalchurch.org/wp-content/uploads/sites/2/2021/01/lm_book_of_occasional_services_2018.pdf) The service uses a large triangular candlestick with fifteen candles, but if you don't have fifteen candles at home, don't sweat it.

### GOOD FRIDAY

The Good Friday service consists of up to three parts: The Liturgy of the Word, the veneration of the cross, and Communion from the reserved Sacrament. The veneration of the cross and Communion from the reserved Sacrament are optional customs in some Episcopal parishes but the Liturgy of the Word is the only required part of the service. A priest is not technically required, meaning that in this unusual time when we do not have a church service, it is perfectly appropriate for us lay people to observe Good Friday in our homes, as a devotional practice. All we need is some quiet, undistracted time, the Book of Common Prayer, a Bible, and a cross. If you do not have a Book of Common Prayer at home, you can find the entire service online at <https://www.bcponline.org>; select "Proper Liturgies for Special Days" and then "Good Friday." If you have more than one cross at home, one that is wooden or lacking in ornamentation would be the most fitting. Candles may help your home feel more like the sanctuary, but they are not necessary. If you live alone, you can celebrate Good Friday on your own just like the Daily Offices. If you live with family, you and especially your children may find it more engaging to divide up the Scripture readings, solemn collects, and other prayers.

### HOLY SATURDAY

For theological reasons, there is never Eucharist on Holy Saturday, and this liturgy is very short and uncomplicated and may also be observed at home, as a devotional practice during this unusual year. You will just need the Book of Common Prayer and a Bible.

### ACCESSING COVID-19 VACCINES

All adults in Texas will be eligible for a Covid-19 vaccine beginning March 29. Of course, this does not mean that appointments for every adult are available immediately, but getting on a waitlist will help get everyone get vaccinated as soon as possible. On Monday, March 29, DSHS released their new website for the vaccine waitlist: <https://getthevaccine.dshs.texas.gov/>. If you do not have internet access, call 833-832-7067 for scheduling support. Adults of any age should go ahead and register. However, people age 80 and above are not required to register in advance; this age category will be moved to the front of the line at vaccine sites. This information is current at the time of printing; check <https://mhchd.org> and <https://www.dshs.texas.gov/coronavirus/immunize/vaccine.aspx> for future updates or changes. Additionally, Gregg County has a vaccine hub and anyone over the age of 16 can get an appointment every weekend to be vaccinated. Visit their web site: <https://vaccinate.christushealth.org/>

### JOB OPENING

Trinity is hiring! We are seeking a part-time Martha's Kitchen Assistant Director. See the detailed description on the next page (as well as the church website) and please share with anyone you think may be a good fit.

## JOB OPENING

Trinity Episcopal Church (TEC) in Marshall, Texas seeks a part-time (Thursdays from 3-7 plus two planning hours weekly, total of 6 hours per week) a Martha's Kitchen Assistant Director (MKAD). Martha's Kitchen is a volunteer-powered community effort to provide about 100 free meals to anyone on Thursday nights based at Trinity Church. Reporting to the Martha's Kitchen Director (MKD), the MKAD is responsible for instructing and supporting volunteer teams. The MKAD will be responsible for assisting with and verifying food safety, adequacy, quality, weekly grocery budget, and sanitation/housekeeping at the end of service and locking the facility. At this time meals are "to-go."

### **Roles and Responsibilities:**

- Communicate well with the MK Director and the Parish Administrator to be sure supplies are ordered and meal is planned at least one week in advance.
- Submit meal plans, grocery lists, and schedule to Parish Administrator and MK Director at least one week in advance by email.
- Email and/or phone call to volunteer team at least ten days in advance to establish meal plan and obtain grocery list in advance.
- Text or other brief confirmation with volunteer team and Parish Administrator regarding supplies two days before service date.
- Assist/oversee the volunteers as needed to plan menus with universal appeal, good quality, appropriate portions, approximate food cost of \$2 a plate, and be handled and packaged in a way that insures food safely.
- Arrive on site on Thursdays at designated time (usually 3 or 4 pm depending on menu as coordinated with volunteer team and Parish Administrator) to welcome volunteers and help them find their way around the kitchen. Participate with volunteers as they prepare and distribute the meal and clean up. At close of shift put trash on curb for pickup and replace liner in trash can. If there are few volunteers or if volunteers are unable, MKAD is responsible for execution of these activities.
- Verify or execute sanitation/housekeeping at conclusion of food service. Kitchen facility must be returned to as good or better than found each Thursday.
- Check refrigerator each week and discard out-of-date items.
- Exercise good stewardship over the resources, supplies, equipment and groceries.
- Ensure that there are always at least two people (including MKAD) planning and serving.
- Treats patrons and volunteers with the utmost respect and kindness.
- Capable of appropriate and assertive management of unanticipated conflict.

- Prompt, conscientious, and self-motivated.
- Works well as part of a team dedicated to the life of the Church.

- Pre employment physical and background check required.


