

# RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS

There is a story in the Gospels (Mt. 9:20-22) about a woman who had a flow of blood for 12 years, and how she is healed just by reaching through the crowd and touching the hem of Jesus' garment. As Jesus walks, He feels the power go out from Him and asked, "Who touched me?" The woman touched him, believing that He would heal her, and so was healed in a way no doctor could accomplish.

I felt the force of this passage in a new way a couple of years ago. We were traveling to Haiti on one on a mission trip, and one day in the main street of the village there was a Carnivale parade. The Americans in our group jumped in and had a blast! Hundreds of people were walking along the path and others were watching from the fields. As we walked, I reflected that the atmosphere must have been similar to the crowds that followed Jesus: all bumping and jostling, nobody knowing just exactly where we were going. It was the kind of situation that would make the question, "Who touched me?" seem obvious: More like, "Who hasn't touched you, Jesus?" And yet, Jesus knows that someone has reached for Him in a special way. Someone touched Him in faith.

Jesus is still like that. The connection of faith unlocks the power of Christ for renewed living. The Eucharist in particular puts this on display. Ordinary bread and wine is consecrated for a holy purpose and when the believer reaches out to receive in faith, the power of Christ goes out from Him. It heals, nourishes and strengthens. One reason I love Church worship is to connect in that special way to Jesus, in order to touch the hem of His garment (if you will) and to feel the comfort of His loving presence. He is there for us if we touch Him in faith.

This summer in Sunday school, we will looking deeper into this idea, and the way Jesus communicates His sanctifying grace to us in the special mysteries of the sacraments. We will talk about how important the sacraments are, how many there are, how they relate to faith and to the preaching of the Word, and much more. And if you can't make it for all of them, don't be discouraged. Each session this summer can stand on its own, so join us! You will be glad you did.

# 39 ARTICLES: COMMENTARY & REFLECTIONS

## *Article V. Of the Holy Ghost*

*THE Holy Ghost, proceeding from the Father and the Son, is of one substance, majesty, and glory with the Father and the Son, very and eternal God.*

Living as we do in the time after the charismatic renewal of the Church in the 60's and 70's, Article V may strike us as a little, well, dull. Not that what it says is untrue, but that there is simply so much more that can be said! Where is the discussion of spiritual gifts, speaking in tongues, and miracle-working? It is a fair objection, and one that highlights the historical situatedness of the Elizabethan Church. Miraculous workings of the Spirit were simply not a bone of contention during the Reformation (unless it concerned the sacraments).

Every age has to deal with its own controversies; some issues are given exaggerated importance while others are unjustly minimized. We can only be thankful that time continues to march on, shedding light on truths previously buried by history.

Still, Article V has a great deal to say about the nature of the Holy Spirit. Its burden is to equate the Spirit with the Father and the Son: “one substance, majesty, and glory”. By making this move, the article makes sure that we all understand that the Spirit is as much of the essence of God as the Son and the Father. What does this mean? It means that when the Spirit is engaging with the world, God is engaging with the world. When the Spirit is speaking to your heart, God is speaking to your heart. When the Spirit is in you, God Himself is in you. The Holy Spirit is God in every way.

The Holy Spirit has a specific role within the Trinity. He is sent by the Father, to apply to us the work of the Son. We have a relationship with Jesus because the Spirit make Him present to us. We get the power to love our enemies because the Spirit makes it available to us. All of the benefits of the Trinity come to us through the Spirit. This is why Jesus told the Apostles to stay in Jerusalem in Acts 1: “*you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you*”. This is why Jesus said that it was good for Him to go away, for then the Helper would come, and bring with Him the power and the presence of Jesus (John 16:7). He is the great Paraclete, the Helper who brings God's salvation and makes it effective for you personally. We pray through the Spirit, labor through the Spirit, and worship through the Spirit. Our whole life as Christians is through the Spirit. This is why the Apostle can speak of the entirety of life the way that he does: “*For from Him, and through Him and to Him are all things. To Him be glory forever. Amen*” (Rom. 11:36).



# YEAR IN REVIEW : YOUTH



## Papaw's Red Slaw

A Trexler Family Recipe



### INGREDIENTS

- 1/2 head of grated cabbage
- desired amount of finely sliced green and red peppers
- 1 - 15oz can of tomatoes (including juice)
- 1/4 cup of sugar
- 1/4 of vinegar
- celery seed to taste
- salt & pepper to taste



### DIRECTIONS

- Place sugar and vinegar into a small jar and shake well to blend.
- Combine cabbage and peppers and tomatoes w/ juice and sugar/vinegar mix
- Season with salt, pepper, and celery salt to taste
- Stir until thoroughly mixed and place in refrigerator in a cover container for several hours before serving.

### ADDITIONAL NOTES:

All recipes evolve over time! Here are some other changes that you might want to experiment with!

- Frank's Red Hot Sauce instead of tomatoes
- Leave out the peppers
- add diced sweet onion
- add oil to your sugar & vinegar blend



# VESTRY : NEWS & UPDATES

Dear Trinity Family,

The vestry has made a lot of progress this year with the major maintenance and repairs needed on our facility. The next critical project to be accomplished is to eliminate the moist conditions beneath the nursery and children's Sunday school classrooms in Fry Hall.

This is a project that has involved several steps over the past 13 years because the building did not originally include proper drainage and ventilation. If you are unaware of the issue, just take a walk to the nursery and observe the moldy odor that is apparent in the hallway.

Our vestries have put a lot of effort into this problem. For years, vestry members manually pumped groundwater out of the crawl space after every heavy rain. Evidence of water movement was apparent throughout the crawl space on the east side of the building and was pumped from a sump near the north wall of the crawl space where it collected.

The vestry met with the original building engineers in 2015 and determined the building was not constructed according to the original design. Repairs would be necessary, but it was not possible to hold any outside parties responsible for the work. In 2016, Trinity opened and expanded the drainage trough that carries drainage water from the north side of Fry Hall, reducing the amount of standing water under Fry Hall and eliminating the need to manually pump standing water. High humidity conditions persisted, and evidence of water movement persisted on the south wall. In 2021, the vestry determined that the ventilation openings in the exterior footing specified on construction drawings were not present.



Trinity was advised by a design engineer it was likely safe to cut the openings, but was unable to do so successfully because of the load carried by the footing.

In early 2022, Trinity engaged Richard Lewis with Johnson and Pace, a structural engineer that has previously worked on Fry Hall. Mr. Lewis developed a report with a list of recommendations to resolve several issues including sticking windows, doors and the moisture problem. He stated that there is no evidence of building movement but that the windows need to be repainted and caulked or replaced. He recommended installation of smaller ventilation openings with powered blowers so that sufficient ventilation could be obtained through fewer and smaller holes. He also described the water intrusion that is ongoing on the south side of the length of Fry Hall due to water from downspouts undermining the footing. In May 2022 the vestry obtained a quote from Slone Construction for concrete and dirt work to convey water from the south side of Fry Hall away from the building. Slone Construction also provided an estimate to install a series of ventilation holes around the structure.

# VESTRY : CONTINUED

Bids were also obtained to caulk and repair the windows. The cost estimates for this work are as follows:

<b>Dirt work and Concrete Sidewalk (Southeast Side):</b>	<b>\$ 9,800</b>
<b>Underground Storm Drains (Southwest Side):</b>	<b>\$ 9,800</b>
<b>Core Drill (15) holes and install vent caps:</b>	<b>\$ 6,600</b>
<b>Electrical Work and Powered Blowers (Estimate):</b>	<b>\$ 4,000</b>
<b>The total estimate is :</b>	<b>\$30,200</b>

Without the work, we risk continued deterioration of the structure as well as the air quality in the nursery, children's Sunday school classes and the chapel.

At this time we have just under \$6,000 available in our "Dollar a Week" maintenance fund, so not enough to begin this project while also being prepared for contingencies. We would like to ask the parish to make a contribution towards this critical maintenance need. We will begin the project as soon as we verify the availability of funds to pay for it, with additional funds available for unexpected repairs like air conditioners etc.

The cost to caulk and paint the windows is \$8,900 but we propose to postpone that less urgent task as necessary to allow time to raise funds.

The vestry is very grateful for your support of our efforts to be good stewards of the church property.
