# Mission of the Quarter

### Marshall - Harrison County Literacy Council

The Marshall-Harrison Literacy Council is a local organization that provides free, adult basic education, GED, English language, computer, and citizenship programs for adults, to help pursue and enjoy more fulfilled and productive lives.

The MHCLC serves adults who live in Marshall, Texas or Harrison County. Our students are persons who are at least 18 yrs. Old and not currently enrolled in a high school program. All of our services are completely free of charge thanks to volunteers and very generous donations from the community members and businesses as well a funding from various grant programs. We offer tutoring for learning English as a second language and also help strengthen Englishskills. Tutors are available to help prepare for the high school equivalency diploma (GED). Students undergo a pre-test to determine their starting point and see what the likelihood is they will be successful in the GED exam. After getting the results from the pre-test, the student will be matched with a tutor. They will review the results and develop a plan for the GED exam.



Servant Ministry Sacrificial Giving Biblical Leadership Reading is vital to everyday life, from reading medication instructions, completing forms, ordering at restaurants and even for a job. We have volunteer tutors ready to help our student become more fluent in reading and develop their language and writing skills. To become a student at MHCLC, you will need to call or stop by and visit with our director. Together the student and director determine if the services offered at MHCLC and the needs of the student are a match. All of our student services are completely free of charge.

Volunteer tutors provide one on one tutoring and small group instruction to our students. Anyone age 21 or older, completes the required training, and makes at least a year-long commitment to the program can be a tutor. Tutors are required to attend at least 6 hours of training and 3 ½ hours of online training before being assigned a student. The tutors will learn that success involves mutual respect, the ability to listen, patience, imagination, and a two-way dialogue along with the "book work." To sign up for training call our office at 903-935-0962, or send an email to the executive director, Karen Bickerdike at mhclc117@gmail.com and put your name on our tutor training list. A confirmation letter or email will be sent before the scheduled training date.

To teach someone to read or speak English, or with math, you'll receive an overview in the Laubach Way to Reading during tutor training and step-by-step training as part of an online instruction course. It's free and available 24/7, so once you've completed the course, you may refer back to the material at any time.

Tutoring can be one of the most rewarding things you've ever done, but it does require commitment of time and energy, as well as patience and understanding. We'd also like you to know we're here and available to help when you've got questions, need advice or just want to talk.




Pizza and Book Study

In Falling Upward, Fr. Richard Rohr seeks to help readers understand the tasks of the two halves of life and to show them that those who have fallen, failed, or "gone down" are the only ones who understand "up." Most of us tend to think of the second half of life as largely about getting old, dealing with health issues, and letting go of life, but the whole thesis of this book is exactly the opposite. What looks like falling down can largely be experienced as "falling upward." In fact, it is not a loss but somehow actually a gain, as we have all seen with elders who have come to their fullness.



I've shared with you over the past two weeks how God has lead me into a heightened discipline of prayer unlike I've experienced in a long time. I also shared with you that I haven't fully discerned whether that is a call to me as an individual, or us as a congregation. On the chance that it is a corportate calling, I want to extend a challenge to you during the season of Lent which begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14th.

During the season of Lent I want to challenge us to pray for one another. We have approximately sixty families in our parish. I want to know if there are twelve people who will take five families each and pray everyday for them as a Lenten discipline. Maybe write or call each one of the families at the beginning of Lent and tell them that you will be praying for them during Lent. Ask them if there are any specific things you can be praying for them during this time.

I have used this scripture below from the third chapter of Ephesians as a model of prayer for others when I didn't know what specifically to pray for, inserting their names in the appropriate places.

I pray that, according to the riches of his glory, God may grant \_\_\_\_\_\_ to be strengthened in their inner being with power through his Spirit and that Christ may dwell in \_\_\_\_\_\_ heart through faith, as (he/she) are being rooted and grounded in love. I pray that they may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that \_\_\_\_\_ may be filled with all the fullness of God.

Can I find twelve people willing to take up the challenge?
