



blessed us with a number of children who will be the mustard seeds of that ministry.

I know that evangelism doesn't come natural for Episcopalians so let this ex-Baptist give you a few pointers. The first thing you must have is a desire for others to know Christ and to be a part of his Church. Second, everything begins prayer. Your prayer might be, "Jesus, give me the opportunity today to speak with someone about your love for them." Pamela and I are currently praying for a handful of people that we want to introduce to Jesus. Our prayer has simply been, "Father, ambush them with your love for them."


Third, and this is where things get a little more difficult, especially if introvert. have you're an conversation with them about Jesus. A parenthetical note, having conversation about the church is not the same as having a conversation about God. Remember, we are more interested discipleship in than membership.

It's estimated that only about ten percent of any congregation has the spiritual gift of evangelism. So, use other people, such as your priest, to have those conversations. Another way to grease the wheels of those important conversations is to invite them to an event where those that are gifted in evangelism will be present. Maybe invite them to *Pints With A Priest* on March 20th.

As I have shared with you before, it is very difficult for an unchurched or dechurched person to walk into a church they are unfamiliar with on Sunday. Evangelism is about relationship. Most people that are Christians didn't go to a Billy Graham crusade. They were simply asked by a friend if they wanted to come to church or come meet their friend Jesus. It is as simple as that.


Remember, this all starts with prayer. Maybe the first prayer is simply, "God give me the desire to have others know you. Lay on my heart the friends of mine that you want to ambush with your love." Then let's watch God begin to move in their lives and draw them closer to Jesus. I warned you I was a recovering Baptist.


